Ocean Park Baptist Church

Derek and Hayden DuBay made a presentation to the BAC regarding their applications for a Conditional Use Permit and Conditional Rezoning to restore and operate a small event venue at Ocean Park Baptist Church located at 3624 Dupont Circle.

The property is currently zoned for residential (R-5D). They are seeking a change to B2 conditional or B1. B1 allows for an event center. The property is 500 feet away from the Brock Center and Mr. DuBay suspects they will one day need to use the building. He addressed neighborhood concerns including:

- -property value
- -noise mitigation: plan to replace doors with sound proof doors, sound test conducted.
- -quality of life
- -parking: 70 spaces are required (currently 35), they will use a mix of mandatory valet and shuttling.
- -landscaping: they plan to plant additional live oaks and hedges that will mitigate sound.
- -alcohol use: events to end at 10pm, 8pm on weekdays.

The DuBay's have already completed outside repairs/improvements to the buildings.

Chairman Davenport said the BAC will not give a recommendation until after planning has completed their review.
