December 2024 Membership Meeting Minutes December 5th at Brock Center

The meeting was called to order at 7:03pm.

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Special Guest: Officer Shoenbach, VBPD

- No crime concerns in our neighborhood other than people leaving car doors open. All of our crimes are down city wide more than 20%.
- Robberies and burglaries and package thefts uptick this time of year. Please be aware of your surroundings! If you are expecting a package, pick it up as soon as possible or ask a neighbor or send it to a secure locker.
- There is a new captain in the 3rd Precinct, Captain Elliott. We will invite him to a meeting to meet everyone.

Danny alerted the police department about the driver doing donuts in the boat ramp parking lot. Parks and Rec may add more speed bumps and put the taller ones back in. Activity is down in the winter.

The only other concern there was a non-reportable self-inflicted death.

The previous meeting minutes were approved after a motion by Andrea Lindemann and a second by Tim Lindemann.

Special Guest: Cindy Dufour, Friends of Live Oaks (FOLO)

Cindy lives in Baylake Pines.

- The live oak is our official city tree.
- Many of the live oaks are hundreds of years old.
- Considered a maritime tree and designed to protect us from wind. Grows well in sandy soil.
- Drops leaves in the spring but is technically an evergreen. They put out a lot of acorns.
- Animals that depend on live oaks: butterflies, raccoons, squirrels and birds.
- Symbol of safety and strength, provided shelter to African Americans. Cindy shared the story of the emancipation oak on the peninsula near fort Monroe.

- The USS constitution is made of live oak.
- They are trying to encourage the city to plant live oaks in city areas and parking lots to provide shade. The trees also help with oxygen.
- The willoughby oak on Norfolk naval station is one of the oldest in Virginia estimated 400-600 years old.
- Leaves store carbon in the soil and make for healthy soil. You can use the leaves as natural mulch.

The trees have an extensive root system.

- Having a live oak can increase the property value of your home and can absorb 50 to 100 gallons of water a day so great for water mitigation..

- FOLO is trying to make developers aware that they can work around the live oaks and they will actually enhance their value!

2025 Budget
